

## Studio Hours with Faculty

### ***What are studio hours with faculty?***

Studio hours are independent study coursework; the focus is on your studio-making progress. Faculty will provide feedback on your work.

### ***Course numbering and meeting expectations:***

Within your emphasis area: Art 669X (Year 1), Art 779X (Year 2), Art 889X (Year 3)

Outside your emphasis area: Art 6008

The number of credit hours you sign up for will determine how many meetings should be scheduled with the faculty member throughout the course of the term.

Number of credit hours enrolled	Number of meetings required in term
1	2-3
2	4-5
3	6+

### ***Which faculty may be considered for my studio hours?***

Any regular, tenured and tenure track graduate faculty members within the Department of Art. This includes faculty within a student's major area and external to the area.

Department of Art faculty with titles such as professor, associate professor, assistant professor, or visiting professor.

### ***How many faculty members should I take hours with per term?***

Students are strongly advised to take hours with 3-4 faculty members per term to stay on track to meet MFA curriculum requirements.

### ***How do I enroll in studio hours with faculty?***

Hours must be indicated on your academic record/advising report to be counted on your MFA Curriculum Checklist. Failure to enroll properly will result in the hours not counting towards fulfilling degree requirements.

Contact faculty member and ask the following:

- Can I take hours with you (specify term)?
- If yes, how many credit hours may I sign up for? What is your unique class number for [specify whether 669X, 779X, 889X, or 6008]?
